Top Rankings of U.T.

In 2008, the Times Higher Education Supplement (THES) ranked the University of Texas as the 70th best school in the world. In 2009, the U.S. News & World Report ranked The University of Texas #47 among "National Universities" and #15 among Public National Universities. (U.S. News & World Report, 2009). According to Washington Monthly #19 nationally (*The Washington Monthly*, 2007), and #38 in an academic ranking of world universities (*Shanghai Jiao Tong University*, 2007). Seven school [doctoral programs](#) ranked in the top 10 in the nation for 2008, with 22 departments also in the top 25. http://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/University_of_Texas_at_Austin)

U.S. News and World Report ranked The [McCombs School of Business](#) first in undergraduate and graduate [accounting](#) programs, the #3 undergraduate and graduate [MIS](#) programs, the #2 undergraduate [marketing](#) program, the #2 undergraduate ethics program, the #4 undergraduate finance program, the #4 management research productivity, the #5 undergraduate international business program, the #5 undergraduate insurance/risk management program, the #10 overall-undergraduate business program (#3 among public universities), and the #18 (full-time) MBA program. A 2005 [Bloomberg](#) survey also ranked the school #5 among all business schools and #1 among public business schools for the largest number of alumni who are [S&P 500 CEOs](#). Similarly, a 2005 *USA Today* report ranked the university as "the number one source of new [Fortune 1000 CEOs](#)".

College of Pharmacy ranked #2 2008 in the nation by *U.S. News and World Report*. Other programs highly ranked by *U.S. News and World Report* include the #7 College of Education, the #10 [Cockrell School of Engineering](#), and the #15 School of Law. Additionally, the university's library system—its main campus library the [Perry-Castañeda Library](#)—ranks #6 among academic libraries in the nation.
